MOORE TO HOST ETHICS TRAINING SEMINAR FOR LOCAL OFFICIALS

Worcester – In response to sweeping reforms to the state’s ethics laws, Senator Michael O. Moore (D-Millbury) will sponsor a local “Conflict of Interest” Seminar for area officials, to help educate them regarding conflict of interest laws. The training will be given by the State Ethics Commission, and is free and open to the public. The Worcester session will be held on Wednesday, October 7, from 5:00 to 7:00 PM at the Central Mass Regional Employment Board, 44 Front Street in Worcester. This will be one of three sessions Sen. Moore will be hosting throughout his district.

“I am pleased to be able to offer these sessions to local officials in my district,” said Sen. Moore. “While the elected and appointed officers of the cities and towns I represent do an exemplary job of upholding the law, with major changes made as a result of ethics reform it is important that they be given the opportunity to re-educate and familiarize themselves with ethics regulations.”

Topics to be covered by the seminars will include financial interests, bribes, gifts and gratuities, nepotism, political activity, and code of conduct, amongst others.

Two additional sessions will be held in Shrewsbury and Auburn, with officials from Shrewsbury, Grafton, and Upton invited to the Shrewsbury session, and officials in Auburn, Millbury, and Leicester invited to the Auburn session. The seminar in Auburn will be held on Thursday, October 15th, from 5:00 to 7:00 PM in the Selectmen’s Room of Auburn Town Hall, 104 Central Street, and the Shrewsbury seminar will take place on Thursday, October 22nd from 5:00 to 7:00 PM at the Shrewsbury Public Library, 609 Main Street in Shrewsbury, in the second-floor meeting room.
